

**Katedra slovenských dejín Filozofickej
fakulty Univerzity Komenského Bratislava**

spolu s Katedrou všeobecných dejín a Katedrou archívnickva a pomocných vied historických, je najstarším profesionálnym pracoviskom historikov na území Slovenska. Svoju činnosť zameranú najmä na školenie mladých historikov a vlastnú vedeckú historickú prácu vykonáva nepretržite od roku 1919. Pracovali, či študovali tu prakticky všetky významné osobnosti slovenskej historiografie. Sami neskôr zakladatelia iných pracovísk a historických škôl. Aj dnes patrí k špičkovým pracoviskám svojho druhu. Dynamický pracovný tím odborníkov sa zameriava na mapovanie širokého rámca slovenských dejín, v zmysle dejín Slovákov a dejín územia Slovenska. Zaoberá sa celým časovým rozsahom dejín, od prahu prehistórie až po nedávnu minulosť, rozsiahlym spektrom tém a rozmanitými prístupmi k nim. Katedra a jej členovia sa dlhodobo venujú vedeckému výskumu a sú koordinátormi a riešiteľmi úloh množstva vedeckých projektov (<http://www.fphil.uniba.sk/index.php?id=ksd>). Okrem pedagogickej činnosti sa katedra programovo zaoberá aj šírením výsledkov vedy a jej popularizáciou pre širokú verejnosť.

together with the Department of General History and the Department of Archival and Auxiliary Sciences of History, are the oldest professional workplaces for historians in the territory of Slovakia. They have been educating young historians and doing their own research continuously since 1919. Almost all distinguished personalities of Slovak historiography have worked or studied here, and some of them later founded other centres and historical schools. The department belongs to the top centres nowadays. The dynamic team of specialists maps a broad range of Slovak history, i.e. the history of Slovaks and the history of the territory of Slovakia. The department investigates a wide spectrum of topics from the whole time scale of history, from the threshold of prehistory to the recent past, and uses a variety of approaches. The historians of the department have long-term experience in historical research. They have coordinated and participated in a number of scientific projects (<http://www.fphil.uniba.sk/index.php?id=ksd>). Besides pedagogical activities, the department aims to disseminate the research results and popularize science amongst broad public.

Filozofski fakultet Sveučilišta u Zagrebu

Studij povijesti na Sveučilištu u Zagrebu započeo je s osnivanjem modernog sveučilišta 1874. godine kada su formirane dvije povijesne katedre, za opću povijest i za hrvatsku povijest. Kasnije su osnovane i druge katedre (za pomoćne povijesne znanosti, za povijest Srednje i Jugoistočne Europe te za metodu nastave povijesti), a katedra za opću povijest preimenovala se i razdijelila u tri: za staru povijest, za svjetsku povijest srednjeg vijeka i za svjetsku povijest novog vijeka. Od 1959. povijesne katedre ujedinjene su u Odsjek za povijest Filozofskog fakulteta Sveučilišta u Zagrebu. Danas je to jedna od dviju središnjih institucija hrvatske historiografije i najveći visokoobrazovni zavod za školovanje historičara i nastavnika povijesti u Hrvatskoj.

Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, University of Zagreb

The History studies at the University of Zagreb began with the founding of the modern university in 1874, when two chairs of history were formed: a chair for world history and a chair for Croatian history. Other chairs were founded later (for auxiliary historical sciences, history of Central and Southeastern Europe, and the didactics of history). The chair of world history was renamed and divided into three: the ancient history, the medieval world history and the modern world history. Since 1959, all those chairs have been united in the Department of History at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. Today it is one of the two central institutions of Croatian historiography and the largest higher education institute for the training of historians and history teachers in Croatia.
